Naseby Rhinehart

Naseby was born in 1911 to Wesley and Crawford Rhinehart in Georgia. Naseby and his parents, two brothers and six sisters moved to Milwaukee when he was four years old. It was in Milwaukee that he learned his athletic skills and would later bring those wares to the collegiate level and UM. His Lincoln High School football team won city titles in 1928 and 1929 and in 1928 he was named an all-city end. He also won the state discus title as a senior.

Naseby Rhinehart became the University of Montana's first athletic trainer in 1935, just one month after he graduated. As a student at UM, he earned nine letters in football, basketball and track – picking up knowledge of injury prevention and treatment first-hand. Rhinehart remained at UM for 47 years, during which time he was one of the first athletic trainers in the nation to develop an athletic training curriculum (1971) at a university. Over this period of time he also was named an athletic trainer for the Pan American Games in Puerto Rico and was selected as an athletic trainer for the 1972 Olympic track teams. In 1967 he was chosen as a member of the Helms Hall of Fame for athletic trainers and in 1974 he was awarded the UM Distinguished Service Award. Naseby is a member of the MTATA, NWATA, and NATA Hall of Fame. The Rhinehart Athletic Treatment Center was named in his honor in 1993. Naseby Rhinehart passed away in 1991. He and his wife Evelyn, who passed away in 2012, had four children: Pete, Sidney, Vodie Ann and Penny.

Who Will Benefit from this Scholarship?

As envisioned, the Naseby and Evelyn Rhinehart Athletic Training Scholarship will be awarded each year to a UM student who has been accepted in the UM CAATE accredited professional master's program who demonstrates a strong commitment to the profession of athletic training. The University of Montana's Department of Health and Human Performance with the UM Foundation are partnering to create this scholarship opportunity. The recipient will be able to use the scholarship for their final year of schooling. The first scholarship will be awarded spring 2016.
