Up to 9 semester credits are accepted for transfer credit with approval of your advisor and the graduate school.

A minimum of 90 semester credits including the master's degree.

A minimum of 9 semester credits outside the Phyllis J. Washington College of Education and Human Sciences.

A minimum of 2/3 of all course work in the primary area must be taken at UM, as well as a minimum of 2/3 of all course work included in the plan.

Successful completion of a departmental comprehensive examination, and application for graduation immediately after passing.

All requirements for the degree must be completed within a maximum of 10 years, with the further restriction of completing the dissertation within 5 years of admission to candidacy (after comps).
